| COMPOSITION | Up to ten (10) directors, three of whom are ex-officio, and the remainder of whom are appointed by the ANA Board of Directors: <br> a. Three (3) directors are ex-officio: <br> (1) ANA President <br> (2) ANA Chief Executive Officer <br> (3) ANA Executive Vice-President/Chief Nursing Officer <br> b. One (1) director shall be a registered nurse who is certified. <br> c. One (1) director shall be a non-nurse/public member. <br> d. Up to five (5) other directors depending on the leadership skills needed to lead ANCC. <br> RNs are required to be full members of ANA during their tenure on the ANCC board. Appointees may not be currently engaged as a volunteer or staff member in any ANCC operational program (e.g., reviewer, appraiser, site visitor, commission member) |
| AUTHORITY ESTABLISHED BY | ANA Board of Directors |
| ACCOUNTABLE TO | ANA Board of Directors |
| RESPONSIBILITY | Responsible and accountable for the overall governance of ANCC and for its supervision, control and direction. The exercise of its responsibility includes protection of the necessary functions of a credentialing body. |
| OFFICERS | a. The officers of ANCC are: <br> 1) President <br> 2) Vice-President <br> 3) Secretary <br> 4) Treasurer <br> b. The president is appointed by the ANA Board of Directors. The only ex-officio member of the ANCC board who is eligible to serve as ANCC President is the ANA President <br> c. Officers other than the president are elected by the ANCC board from among its members |
| TERM OF OFFICE | a. Up to four (4) directors, including the ANCC President, are appointed in odd-numbered years and up to three (3) directors are appointed in even-numbered years to serve terms of two (2) years or until their successors are appointed. <br> The president of the ANCC board is appointed by the ANA Board of Directors to serve a two-year (2-year) term or until a successor is appointed; The president serves no more than two (2) consecutive two-year (2-year) terms. |


|  | b. Officers other than the president serve terms of two (2) yearsor until their successors are elected. |
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| TERM LIMIT | a. Except for the ex-officio members, no director serves more than four (4) consecutive terms or more than eight (8) consecutive years on the Board. <br> b. A director or officer who has served more than one-half $(1 / 2)$ term is considered to have served a full term. |
| TIME COMMITMENT | Regular meetings of the board shall be held at least annually at a time and place determined by the board and special meetings may be called by the president or upon request of a majority of the members. <br> Currently: <br> a. The ANCC board meets face-to-face three times annually for two (2) days. <br> b. The Executive Committee of the board (i.e., President, VicePresident, Secretary, Treasurer) may have called orscheduled teleconferences two (2) to four (4) times annually depending on the needs of ANCC. <br> c. Board members may be asked to serve on an organizational committee (e.g., Bylaws Committee). These committees generally hold teleconferences with a varied schedule but usually not more than two (2) or three (3) times per year. |
| EXPERIENCE AND SKILLS | Board members will be selected based on the current needs of the organization, which requires a variety of experts, including: <br> a. Credentialing experience (certification, accreditation, recognition programs) <br> b. Health care business financing and/or general business financing <br> c. Business of healthcare operations to include product launch, mergers and acquisitions, positioning in competitive market operations <br> d. Marketing <br> e. Technology and new product development. Specific experience from the technology business sector as source of information on how to leverage technology in the credentialing business. <br> f. Leadership in facilities with ANCC credentials. Healthcare association leadership to include experience from the regulatory aspect. <br> g. Public member <br> i. International business experience (either US or foreign resident) with new product entry, <br> j.
